

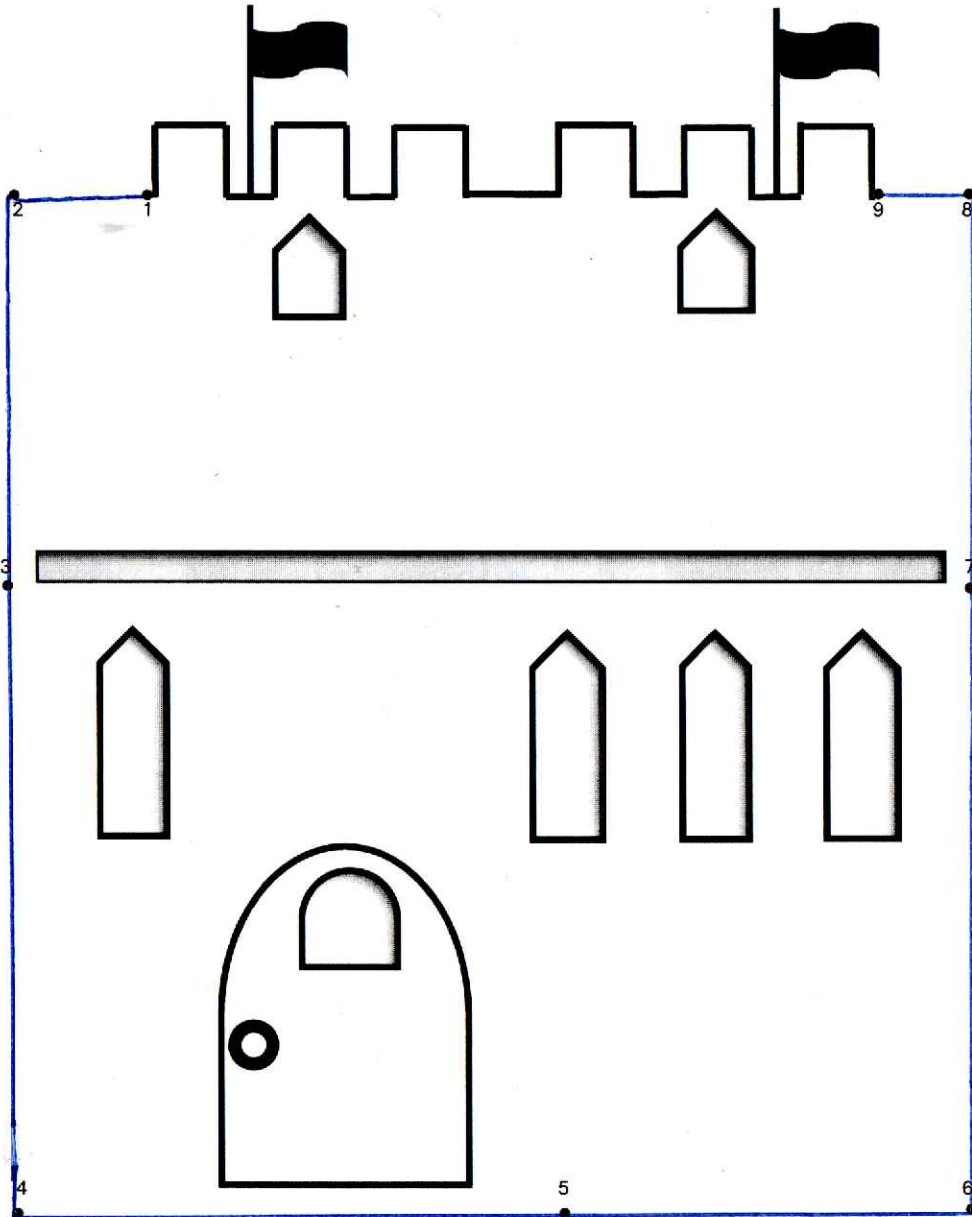

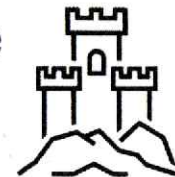


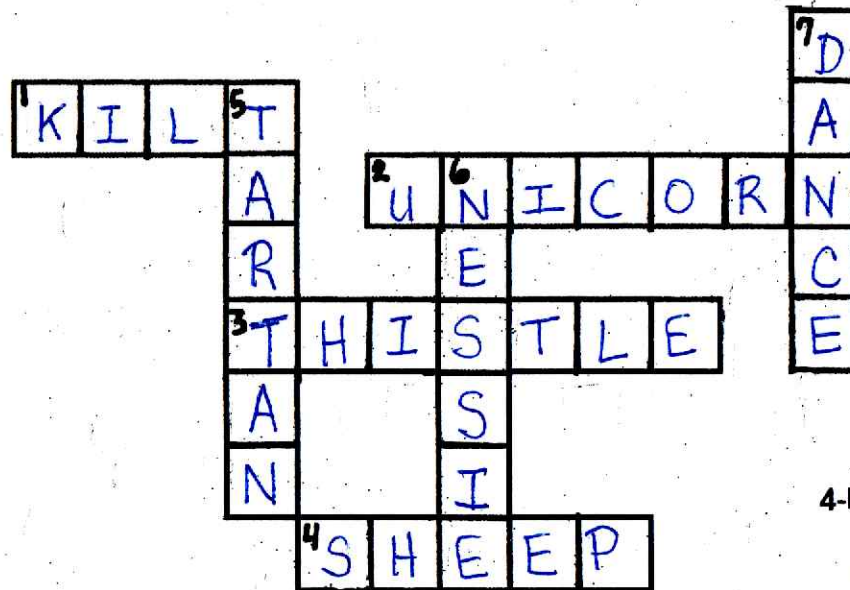

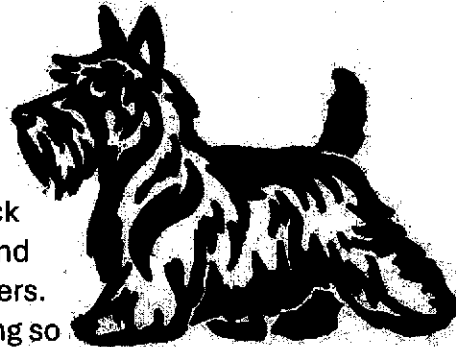
Same or Different?

Scottish Terrier

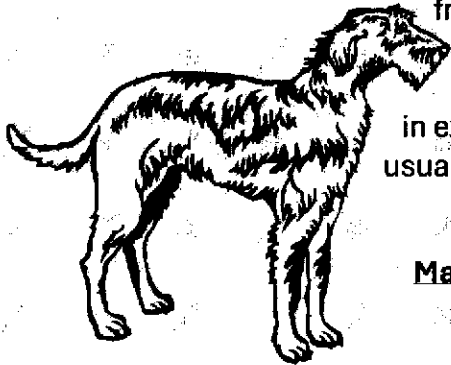
The Scottish Terrier dates back to 1500-era (A.D.) Scotland and were developed to hunt badgers.

Their tails are especially strong so they could be pulled out from holes they dug. Their coat is wiry, and their faces look like they have a beard. They are generally about 10" tall and weigh about 18-22 lbs.



Irish Wolfhound

The Irish Wolfhound was originally used to drag men from their horses and off of their chariots. They are gentle, calm, and loyal. The breed dates back to around 1500 (B.C.) They are the tallest dog breed in existence. They are about 32" tall or more and they usually weigh between 105 - 120 lbs.
